INDIVIDUAL CHARGED AFTER BREAK & ENTER REPORTED IN THAMES CENTRE

(THAMES CENTRE, ON) - Middlesex County OPP charge individual after investigating a break and enter in Thames Centre.

On May 30, 2026, at 9:09 a.m., members of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), were dispatched to a property at 4340 Cromarty Drive in the Municipality of Thames Centre, for the report of break and enter.

Investigation revealed an individual gained entry to an office on the property sometime during the overnight hours and proceeded to steal an undisclosed amount of Canadian currency.

As a result of the investigation a person of interest was identified at which time they were placed under arrest and transported to the Middlesex OPP detachment.

As a result, a 39-year-old of no fixed address has been charged under the Criminal Code with:

Break, Enter a place - commit indictable offence, Possession of a prohibited device or ammunition

The accused has been released from police custody and is scheduled to attend the Ontario Court of Justice in London on July 17 to speak to the charges.

VEHICLE STOLEN FROM RESIDENCE IN THORNDALE

(THAMES CENTRE, ON) - Middlesex County OPP investigating a vehicle stolen from residence in Thorndale.

On June 4, 2026, at 7:55 a.m., members of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), were dispatched to a residence on Aspen Circle in Thorndale, Municipality of Thames Centre, for the report of a stolen vehicle.

It was determined an unknown individual(s) gained access to the vehicle by smashing a window sometime during the overnight hours and proceeded to steal a white, 2023, Toyota Tundra. The investigation is continuing.

TRAFFIC STOP FOR STUNT DRIVING LEADS TO IMPAIRED DRIVER

(MIDDLESEX CENTRE, ON) - Driver facing Impaired charge after traffic stop for stunt driving.

On June 6, 2026, at 3:45 a.m., a member of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) while on general patrol in Komoka in the Municipality of Middlesex Centre, observed a vehicle travelling at nearly three times the posted rate of speed in the 50km/h zone on Glendon Drive.

A traffic stop was initiated at which time the driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Middlesex OPP Detachment.

As a result, a 36-year-old of St. Thomas, has been charged under the Criminal Code, Highway Traffic Act and Compulsory Automobile Insurance Act with: Operation while impaired – alcohol, Operation while impaired - blood alcohol concentration (80 plus), Dangerous Operation, Drive Motor Vehicle - Perform stunt - Excessive speed, Fail to surrender insurance card

The accused has been released from police custody and is scheduled to appear in the Ontario Court of Justice to speak to the charges on July 7, 2026.

FAIL TO REMAIN COLLISION LEADS TO IMPAIRED CHARGE

(MIDDLESEX CENTRE, ON) - Driver facing Impaired driving charge after fail to remain collision in Middlesex Centre.

On June 6, 2026, at 9:26 p.m., members of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) were dispatched to Highbury Avenue North near Nine Mile Road in the Municipality of Middlesex Centre, for the report of a two-vehicle collision.

One involved vehicle failed to remain at the scene of the collision, however, was located a short time later on Ilderton Road. There were no injuries reported.

As a result, a 48-year-old of Ilderton, has been charged under the Criminal Code with: Operation while impaired – Alcohol, Operation while impaired - blood alcohol concentration (80 plus), Dangerous Operation, Failure to stop after accident

The accused has been released from police custody and is scheduled to appear in the Ontario Court of Justice in London to speak to the charges on July 7, 2026.

SINGLE VEHICLE ROLLOVER LEADS TO IMPAIRED CHARGE FOR YOUTH

(THAMES CENTRE, ON) - Seventeen-year-old driver facing impaired charge after single-vehicle rollover on Nissouri Road.

On June 7, 2026, at 5:35 a.m., members of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) were dispatched to Nissouri Road near Evelyn Drive in the Municipality of Thames Centre, for the report of a single vehicle rollover.

The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Middlesex OPP detachment. There were no injuries reported.

As a result, a 17-year-old of Mount Brydges, has been charged under the Criminal Code and Liquor Licence Control Act with: Operation while impaired – alcohol, Operation while impaired - blood alcohol concentration (80 plus), Novice driver - B.A.C. above zero, Person under 19 years having liquor

The accused has been released from police custody and is scheduled to appear in the Ontario Court of Justice in London to speak to the charges on July 13, 2026. The youth's identity is protected under the Youth Criminal Justice Act (YCJA).

TRAFFIC COMPLAINT LEADS TO IMPAIRED CHARGE

(NORTH MIDDLESEX, ON) - Driver charged with impaired after traffic complaint received of possible impaired driver.

On June 7, 2026, at 1:09 p.m., members of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), were dispatched to the report of a possible impaired driver travelling in Lambton County and possibly on route to an address in the Municipality of North Middlesex.

The vehicle was located by members of the Middlesex County OPP in Nairn at which time a traffic stop was initiated. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Middlesex OPP detachment.

As a result, a 50-year-old of Nairn, has been charged under the Criminal Code with: Operation while impaired – alcohol, Operation while impaired - blood alcohol concentration (80 plus)

The accused has been released from police custody and is scheduled to appear in the Ontario Court of Justice in London to speak to the charges on July 6, 2026.

MISCHIEF AND THEFT INVESTIGATION IN GLENCOE

(SOUTHWEST MIDDLESEX, ON) - Middlesex OPP investigating a mischief and theft incident in Glencoe.

On June 8, 2026, at 3:55 p.m., members of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), were

dispatched to a school at 3719 Parkhouse Drive in Glencoe, the Municipality of Southwest Middlesex, for the report of a mischief and theft of a flagpole containing a Canadian flag and Pride flag.

It was determined an unknown individual(s) entered onto the school property around 2:00 a.m., on June 6, knocked the flagpole over and proceeded to steal the pole and flags.

The investigation is continuing.

SEARCH WARRANT RESULTS IN RECOVERY OF \$26,000 WORTH OF STOLEN PROPERTY

(MIDDLESEX COUNTY, ON) - Search warrant executed in London results in stolen property and firearm related charges.

On June 10, 2026, members of the Elgin-Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Community Street Crime Unit (CSCU) and the Oxford-Brant CSCU, executed a search warrant at an address on Blackwell Boulevard in the City of London.

Over the past few months multiple retail locations have been targeted by criminals in a multi-jurisdictional theft operation. As part of the ongoing investigation and with the assistance of a retail theft investigator, two individuals were identified and have been arrested.

CSCU members seized a firearm, as well as just over \$26,000 in recovered stolen items, including alcohol, clothing, sporting goods, home appliances, barbecues and tools.

A 49-year-old of London, has been charged under the Criminal Code with: Unauthorized Poss of a Firearm, Careless storage of Firearm, Weapon, Prohibited device or ammunition, Trafficking in property obtained by crime, Possession Property Obtained by Crime Over \$5,000 - in Canada

A 43-year-old of London, has been charged under the Criminal Code with: Unauthorized Poss of a Firearm, Careless storage of Firearm, Weapon, Prohibited device or ammunition, Trafficking in property obtained by crime, Possession Property Obtained by Crime Over \$5,000 - in Canada

The accused have been released from police custody and are scheduled to attend the Ontario Court of Justice in London on August 5, 2026, to speak to the charges.
