TWO-VEHICLE COLLISION SENDS SIX INDIVIDUALS TO HOSPITAL

(NORTH MIDDLESEX, ON) - A two-vehicle collision sent six individuals to hospital with serious injuries.

On July 23, 2026, at 5:52 p.m., members of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), Middlesex-London Paramedic Service, and North Middlesex fire, were dispatched to the intersection of Nairn and Centre Roads, Municipality of North Middlesex for the report of a serious two-vehicle collision between two passenger vehicles.

As a result, six individuals were transported to hospital where all injuries were determined to be non-life-threatening injuries.

The intersection was closed for approximately six hours as police investigated and has since opened.

A 75-year-old driver of London has been charged under the Highway Traffic Act with Fail to yield to traffic on through highway.

OPP INVESTIGATES SERIOUS COLLISION

(STRATHROY-CARADOC) - Police are investigating a serious single vehicle collision in the Township of Strathroy-Caradoc.

On Saturday, August 2, 2026, shortly before 7:00 a.m., members of the Middlesex County Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), Strathroy-Caradoc Fire Services and Middlesex Emergency Medical Services responded to a single motor vehicle collision between Hickory Drive and Centre Road on Highway 402 in the eastbound lanes. A sedan collided with the guiderail and left the roadway.

The 24-year-old driver from London was taken to a local hospital with life-threatening injuries.

The eastbound lanes of Highway 402 between Centre Road and Hickory Drive will be closed for several hours to facilitate the investigation. The Middlesex County OPP is conducting the investigation with the assistance from OPP West Region Traffic Enforcement and Management Team.

SUSPENDED DRIVER FACING MULTIPLE CHARGES

(MIDDLESEX CENTRE, ON) - In-car camera alert results in suspended driver.

On July 28, 2026, at 4:39 p.m., a Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) member, while on general patrol on Westdel Bourne in the Municipality of Middlesex Centre, was alerted by the Automated Licence Plate Recognition (ALPR) system, of a vehicle possibly being operated with unattached licence plates.

A traffic stop was initiated at which time the driver exited the vehicle and attempted to evade police.

Police confirmed the licence plates were not registered on the vehicle and the driver was suspended at which time the driver was placed under arrest.

As a result, a 32-year-old of London, has been charged under Highway Traffic Act, Trespass to Property Act and Compulsory Automobile Insurance Act with: Use plate not authorized for vehicle, Driving while under suspension, Enter premises when entry prohibited, Owner operate a motor vehicle without insurance

The accused has been released from police custody and is scheduled to appear in the Ontario Provincial Traffic Court to speak to the charges at a later date.

MIDDLESEX OPP INVESTIGATING A HOME INVASION IN THAMES CENTRE

(THAMES CENTRE, ON) - Middlesex County OPP investigating a home invasion in Thames Centre.

On August 5, 2026, at approximately 7:34 a.m., members of the Middlesex County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) responded to the report of a vehicle fire on Rebecca Road in the Municipality of Thames Centre.

Investigation revealed the burned-out vehicle belonged to an individual not far from the scene. Officers attended the registered owner's residence on Nissouri Road and were met by the owner who was suffering from injuries.

It was determined that several unknown individuals forcefully entered the residence and confronted the lone occupant inside. The occupant received minor injuries following an altercation with the suspects.

The suspects proceeded to steal the homeowner's vehicle and fled the scene. Further updates will be provided when new information becomes available. The investigation is continuing
